NEW PSHE SCHEME

Pupils started work on their new Personal Social Health Education Scheme, Jigsaw. During a special assembly to launch this half-term's theme on relationships, pupils brainstormed all the ingredients they would need to make a friendship cake. Among their answers: were a litre of honesty, 200g of love, a pinch of kindness, a spoonful of care, a sprinkle of respect, 2 spoonfuls of trust and a handful of harmony. Each half term they will study a different theme which is the same throughout the school but adjusted for their age group.



Other themes to be covered throughout the year include:



- Being Me in My WorldCelebrating Difference
- Dreams and Goals
- Healthy Me
- Changing Me which we will link to our Journey in Love

Each session will start off with a mindfulness session to get the children focused and then they will explore the different themes through stories, presentations and videos. During their lessons they will follow the Jigsaw Charter:

- We take turns to speak.
- We use kind and positive words.
- We listen to each other.
- We have the right to pass.
- We only use names when giving compliments or when being positive.
 - We respect each other's privacy.

To help them remember when it is their turn to speak, they will hold their Jigsaw Friend which is used as 'the talking object'.
