GOSPEL REFLECTION John 14:15-16, 23-26

Last Sunday we celebrated the Feast of Pentecost. Pentecost means 50 in Greek as the Holy Spirit came to the disciples 50 days after Easter.

The scripture reading on Sunday shared part of the last conversation Jesus had with his disciples before he died; he was preparing them to live without his leadership. Jesus told them that if they loved him, they would do as he had asked them.

He asked them to love one another as he has loved them. And he said that if they did this, then God would send the Holy Spirit to be with them forever. The Holy Spirit will teach the disciples everything they need to know once Jesus has left and will remind them of Jesus' words while he was with them.
