GOSPEL REFLECTION

Gospel: John 16:12-15

Last Sunday was Trinity Sunday, which explains that God is made up of three parts: the Father, the Son and the Holy Spirit. In the Gospel, we hear about how Jesus will send the Holy Spirit to be with the disciples when he had returns to heaven. This story is part of Jesus' farewell conversation to the disciples before he dies on the cross.

Jesus says to the disciples that after he has gone, the Holy Spirit will guide them. The Holy Spirit will be their teacher and will speak to them just as Jesus did when he was alive and with them. The Holy Spirit will show the disciples what they must do and what they must say in Jesus' name. It is good to reflect on who teaches us and guides us.
