#### **GOSPEL REFLECTION**

**Gospel: Luke 9:11-17** 

Last Sunday, we heard how Jesus performed a great miracle with bread for five thousand people.

The disciples want to send the crowd away to find food and shelter. But Jesus says that the disciples have to feed the people themselves. Jesus wants them to care about the people they meet and whether they are hungry or not. He wants God's love to be shown through the disciples. Jesus took the five loaves and two fish, blessed them, broke them up and asked the disciples to share them around. In the gospel, everyone, all 5000 people, eat the bread and the fish, and there is plenty left over, twelve baskets full!

Even though there is enough food produced in the world to feed everyone there are many people who go without food every day – both here in the UK and in other countries. The food in our world is not shared out fairly.

We are all members of one global family. We are all parts of one body – the body of Christ. So if one person is hungry, it is like we are all hungry.

Just like Jesus asks the disciples to feed the crowd in today's reading, we are also asked to do what we can to make sure that everyone has enough to eat.
