## GOSPEL REFLECTION

**Gospel: Luke 10:1-12, 17-20**

*In last Sunday's Gospel, we hear that 72 people are sent out on a mission by Jesus to towns and villages all over the place, to prepare the way for Jesus and his disciples.*

Jesus tells these 72 people that there is much work to do, but not enough people to do it. *"The harvest is great, but the labourers are few."* He is asking for their help.

Jesus tells them to travel light without a purse, bag or sandals and not to greet anyone they meet on the road as they are in a hurry. There is no time to waste.

The 72 followers are told that they may not be welcome in every town. Not everyone will want to hear their message. They were going into towns where people were busy with other things.

The disciples were asking them to change their life and to follow Jesus, but the people were too busy to listen, or not ready to change their ways.

We should think of things in life that stop us from spending time with Jesus; how can we be more like the 72 people?

It is important to follow Jesus and share the good news.
