SCHOOL DINNERS

As was mentioned in our 12th July newsletter, please remember that ISS launched a new lunch ordering system at the end of last term. Y5 & Y6 KNIFE CRIME TALK

Y5 & Y6 pupils received a talk this week from the Metropolitan Police on knife crime and gangs. The officers showed the pupils a video about the devastating impact knife crime has on the family of victims who have been killed. They informed pupils about the different ways gangs groomed and coerced young people to join their gang. They also talked about how anyone associated with a knife crime are being punished with long prison sentences regardless of whether they were the ones that actually committed the act of stabbing someone.

GOSPEL REFLECTION

Luke 14:25-33

In last Sunday's Gospel Jesus tells the crowds two short stories to explain what being a disciple means, and to show us that if we want to follow him we must give up everything.

We must also "carry our cross" which means accepting the things we find difficult in our lives and asking for God's help in these difficult things. Jesus is telling us that following him and being a disciple is something that we have to see through to the finish. We need to follow Jesus always and this is not always easy, because we are often distracted by other people or by thinking about what we want, rather than about what Jesus wants for us.

Throughout our lives as followers of Jesus we might have to choose to do what Jesus wants, even though it may be difficult.
