Non-residential drivers on these roads during the prohibited times will receive a fine of £130 (discounted by 50% if paid within 14 days).

ATTENDANCE


The whole school attendance last week was: 95, 33%.


The class winner for the best attendance last week was: 4S with 99.33%.
