I am very pleased to introduce the latest member of staff, Lola!


She is a trained therapy dog who will be under the supervision of Mrs Hartt and will be working with many children across the school. Look out for Lola Alerts in the coming weeks!

Monday 2nd December 2019: We have been informed that the School Clean Air Zones driving restrictions start from today. Gospel: Luke 20:27-38

In last Sunday's Gospel a group of religious leaders who were from rich families, did not believe in resurrection. They asked Jesus a question to trap him, to catch him out.
