You will get the opportunity to meet our play therapist, learning mentor and Emotional Literacy Support Assistant, find out more about the work they are doing with children and have an informal chat with them.

The theme this year is Stand Together and marks 75 years since the liberation of Auschwitz and the 25^{th} anniversary of the genocide in Bosnia. GOSPEL REFLECTION

Gospel: Luke 2:22-40 Sunday 2nd February

The time came for Joseph and Mary to perform the ceremony of purification as the Law of Moses commanded. So they took Jesus to Jerusalem to present him to the Lord, as it is written in the law of the Lord: "Every firstborn male is to be dedicated to the Lord." At that time there was a man named Simeon living in Jerusalem. He was a good God-fearing man and was waiting for Israel to be saved. The Holy Spirit was with him and had assured him that he would not die before he had seen the Lord's promised Messiah.

Led by the Spirit, Simeon went into the Temple, he took Jesus in his arms and gave thanks to God:

"Now, Lord, you have kept your promise, and you may let your servant go in peace.

With my own eyes I have seen your salvation, which you have prepared in the presence of all peoples: A light to reveal your will to the Gentiles and bring glory to your people Israel."

Simeon blessed them and said to Mary, "This child is chosen by God for the destruction and the salvation of many in Israel. He will be a sign from God which many people will speak against and so reveal their secret thoughts. And sorrow, like a sharp sword, will break your own heart.
