Dear Parents and Carers,

I hope you and your families continue to keep safe and well. I appreciate there has been a great deal of information shared with you over the last few weeks, however the Government guidance remains the same, only children in YR,Y1, Y6, Key Workers and those considered to be vulnerable, will attend school. We have now confirmed all these places; the cluster groups and staffing has been organised. It was lovely to see the children and families from these groups, return this week, almost like old times! If arrangements for your child's return have been confirmed by the school, we expect them to turn up, unless they are unwell, in which case please phone the school. Please see the reminder below:

- Y6- Monday to Thursday 10.00-3.00pm
- Y1- Monday to Thursday 9.00-3.15pm
- YR-Tuesday to Thursday 9.30-2.45pm

They should bring:

- A water bottle.
- Home learning pack in a plastic bag.
- School reading book.
- Wear school uniform but without a tie or blazer.

They should not bring:

- A school bag
- Pencil cases
- Mobile phones
- PE kit
- Coat (unless the weather is bad).

You should have all received your child's school report by now, I would be grateful if you could please complete the parent comment slip and send it back to the school, or scan it to the teacher. In addition, if your child has completed any work they would like to share, please email it to the class teacher and it may be posted on the class blog. We expect the children to log into the class blog at least twice a week; therefore the teacher can support them with their home learning. I wish you all a restful weekend, please stay safe.

MATHS WEEK LONDON - LONDON ROCK 2020!

From June 22nd to June 26th the children of SSPP are invited to take part in an online competition against all schools in London! The competition will start on Monday 22nd June at 2pm and finish on Friday 26th June at 7pm. We want to find which class can answer the most times tables questions correctly in London Rocks 2020. During the competition, which runs from 14:00 (2pm) to 19:00 (7pm) each day, every correct answer that a pupil gives, in any game type, will contribute to their class's score. To make it as fair as possible, the winning class and the winning school will be based on the *average* number of correct answers per participating pupil. There is a minimum player count of 5 for each class. If fewer than 5 children in the class play in the competition, their total will be divided by 5 regardless.

Miss Bond has registered all of the pupils in year 2, 3, 4, 5 and 6. So you need to log into TTRS and play as many games as you can at some point between 2 and 7 pm. If you play at another time in the day, it will not count towards your class's score! There will be prizes and certificates for a range of winners including the best class and for the top individual players. So get times table rocking!
