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Dear Parents and Carers,

We have come to the end of the first half term in this very unusual year! The children have been amazing; they have adapted well to the new procedures in school and are enjoying some of the more positive benefits such as more space in the playground at lunchtime. They also have extremely clean hands!

So far, we have not needed to close any areas of the school due to children testing positive for Covid. We have been made aware of parents who have tested positive and in these cases, their children have self-isolated for 14 days, even though they have not displayed any symptoms. It is vital that parents maintain the safety measures in place; you must wear a face covering when you attend the school site, even when queuing outside the school gates. Face coverings must cover your nose and mouth and should not be removed when talking. We have noticed that small groups of parents are congregating in the playground after collecting their children; please leave the site as soon as you have collected your child. Redbridge is now in Tier 2; therefore we must do all we can to avoid a local lockdown, please see our school website for Covid advice and quidance. (Click on the links below – pdf version only)

Harvest

The impact of Covid-19 is far-reaching and goes beyond the issues it has caused with people's health. Never has it been more important to give a little of what we have at harvest time.



Every year, we are overwhelmed with your generosity in donating items for our harvest collection and we are once again reaching out to you.

In the week we return after half term, we are asking children to bring in a donation from home — this will be quarantined in class boxes for a number of days before it is further sanitised and then distributed where it is most needed.



Year 6 made further links to their topic of World War One when they studied the life of Walter Tull. After losing both of his parents, Walter grew up in a London orphanage. He threw himself into sport, and eventually joined Tottenham as only the second ever black professional footballer. Despite being forced to face racist chanting and attitudes, Walter was an exceptional player whose career was only cut short when WW1 broke out. At this time, he left his job and immediately signed up to fight in the army. His natural leadership skills saw him rise to the rank of 2nd Lieutenant, becoming the first black officer in the entire British Army, even though, at the time, this was against army rules. He gave his life on the battlefield in 1918 – a hero and an inspiration to all.

Year 6 created large, biographical pieces in the style of a text they have worked from called 'Young, Gifted and Black'. They went on to use watercolours and pencils to make commemorative stamp designs before producing thoughtful and emotive poems about Walter's life.





















Y6 - Y7 Secondary Transition - Final Reminder

If your child is in Year 6 you need to complete an application for a secondary school place by 31st October 2020. You will need to set up an account at https://www.redbridge.gov.uk/schools/secondary-school-admissions

Please be aware, if you are applying for a Catholic secondary school, there is an additional form which will need signing by your Parish Priest. This is needed to supplement the online application.
