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Dear Parents and Carers,

As we approach the final weeks of term, we reflect on the difficulties faced by our community. We have endured a second lockdown, however the children have continued to attend school in high numbers, 97% and once again, we remain relatively unaffected by Covid-19. Please continue to keep up the excellent communication, as I do believe this is a positive factor in keeping everyone safe.

The children are now busy rehearsing nativity concerts, which will be recorded and shared on the class blogs for you to enjoy. As you may appreciate, the teachers have worked hard to deliver the true meaning of Christmas, with all the current restrictions in place. I know you will all miss the wonderful atmosphere in school and the KS2 carol concert in church; however we are all together in Spirit and look forward to a time when we can enjoy celebrations in school.

I am sorry to say, we have asked children not to bring in Christmas cards for other children in school this year; we are trying to avoid any possibility of cross contamination; this also applies to tins of sweets to be shared out.

A message was sent out last week, regarding Shine afterschool and breakfast club. I am working with the owner of Shine to see if it is possible to keep the club open with the low numbers we have at present due to Covid. 



Year 4 were given the chance to explore and study the life of Martin Luther King. The obvious focus in these sessions, was on non-violence, peaceful protest and the power of speech.


Their first lesson this week involved them questioning where their morals lie and what they would stand up for. They were given various scenarios and asked to respond to each one.



They looked at Martin Luther King as a campaigner in the 'Civil Rights Movement', a movement that sought to give African Americans the same rights as white Americans.


It was important for the children to see the significance of his faith and the role Christianity and the Bible and how that played a part in forming his famous 'I have a dream' speech.

Further time was spent looking at the life of other inspirational African American role models such as Michael Jordan, Serena Williams and Michelle Obama.














West Ham Corner




In such difficult times, we would like to take short moment each week to celebrate any news within the SSPP Community which brings a smile to our faces.

Class 4W - Science

4W have been investigating the effect of tooth decay using eggs to be left in different substances to compare to resemble the effect of what would happen to a tooth. We chose an egg, as this resembles the enamel that protects

the tooth just as the egg shell protects the egg. We used the experiment to investigate the effect on the eggs after 48 hours of them being in three different types of liquids. The liquids we chose were water, milk and Pepsi. We noticed that the egg in water hadn't changed much at all. The egg in milk had gone rotten and the milk had curdled horribly

leaving solidified stains on the egg (which probably wouldn't be very good for your teeth). We also noticed that the egg in Pepsi had left dirty stains on the egg formed from the acid in the Pepsi. So don't forget to clean your teeth!







Class 4W - Design & Technology (with an Art focus)

4W created broaches inspired by the Anglo-Saxons, which has been the focus of their topic lessons this term. Broaches were designed individually using materials such as jewels, glitter, coloured paper, cardboard, tracing paper and other plastic gem-like resources. The idea was to create symmetrical and intricate patterns on their broaches using the colours and designs that Anglo-Saxons would have used (these were known as Royal colours to them). These colours included gold, silver, red, green, and purple. The class enjoyed creating their broaches and put some wonderful designs together. You could say they really tied their ideas together!
