Dear Parents and Carers,

Happy New Year to you all; I hope you managed to enjoy Christmas with your families. On behalf of myself and the staff I would like to say thank you for the very thoughtful cards and presents and also the kind get well messages sent to me personally. The school has been hard hit since the last week of term, with many members of staff testing positive, some are now on the road to recovery, but some members of staff are still suffering the effects of this serious virus. I ask you to keep all our community in your thoughts and prayers. I am incredibly proud of how the staff have responded to this very short notice remote learning; they are a fantastic, caring team. Since the Christmas break, there has been two very important announcements from the Prime Minister, the first on 31st December to close schools in high risk areas of Tier 4, for two weeks, then a further announcement on Monday 3rd January putting the country back into National Lockdown and closing schools until February half term.

The Prime Minister has stressed that schools will only open for children who are vulnerable and those whose parents are 'Critical Workers' those whose work is critical to the Coronavirus response. This lockdown is very different to the one in the spring term, as the Prime Minister is recommending that children should stay at home where possible and schools should deliver a remote education to all children.

Even though many of our teachers are still not fully recovered, we are delivering live English and maths lessons everyday along with story sessions for the younger children. This has been appreciated by parents, as the children look forward to seeing their teacher every day and having the opportunity to interact with them. It is only possible to deliver these live lessons while the pupil numbers in school are low, as many teachers are delivering the lessons from home. I am aware of some issues with technology at the beginning of the week, which have now been addressed; please ensure we have your correct contact details listed, in order to send information regarding Zoom meetings etc.

Thank you parents for being so understanding; I know how difficult it is for you at home, to suddenly become the 'teacher'. However, there is a very clear structure for the children to follow every day; they should understand that remote learning is SCHOOL at home, therefore they need to be up and dressed appropriately for all lessons and also continue with their independent topic work daily. The teachers take a register and if the children are not attending the lessons, a member of the SLT will contact you. Where possible, all the work should be completed in the children's homework books.

Please refer to the Zoom information sheet for parents, which is in the Covid-19 folder on the school website, in remote learning; this will advise you on how to keep your child safe online and the protocols for attending live lessons.

SSPP were allocated a small number of devices from the Department of Education; we have been distributing these, to families in need and we are currently trying to source some more laptops and Chromebooks, which may help other families.

I wish you all a safe weekend.







Student Tips for Participating in Online Learning | March 2020

Our own rules and advice include:

+ You should arrive promptly, latecomers will not be admitted.

+ You should be dressed ready to learn - no pyjamas!

+ You should change your user name to your first name only on whichever device you are using.

+ You should ensure you are muted when you arrive.

+ Your video must be on at all times — you should not be moving between having it on and off (if your video is not on you will be removed from the Zoom meeting room).

+ Where permitted – the 'chat' function is for asking sensible questions which might not need an immediate answer.

+ You should be somewhere quiet where you are able to work, with access to any resources you may require.

+ You have been issued a private meeting ID and password – this is for you alone and should not be shared.
