Dear Parents and Carers,

Unfortunately we had a pupil test positive for Covid-19 this week; this is the first reported case since the children returned on 8th March. Due to the protective measures in place, such as social distancing and good ventilation, we have only needed to isolate a small number of children, following the Government guidelines. If your child has been told to isolate, under no circumstances must you bring them to the school to collect siblings, they must stay at home for the required period, which is usually 10 days. If your child has one of the following Covid symptoms such as:

- A high temperature.
- A new continuous cough. This means coughing a lot for more than an hour, or 3 or more coughing episodes in 24
- A loss of, or change in, normal sense of taste or smell.
- Diarrhoea/vomiting (not a common symptom of COVID-19)

They must stay at home and get tested. Community rates in Redbridge have been steadily increasing over the last 3-4 weeks with over 500 pupils isolating because of positive cases in over 20 schools. Please maintain social distancing and wear a mask when visiting the school site. We are asking you to do this to reduce the further spread of COVID 19 to others in the community.

This week, we went ahead with our Sports Day events; spread across a few days, with perfect weather, no rain and not too hot! The children were all fantastic and had fun, even without their parents cheering them on!

Thank you to all the Y6 parents who attended the virtual meeting on Relationship and Sex Education this week and the Nursery parents who attended the induction meeting today. Next week, we see our Year 6 pupils depart for Stubbers Adventure Centre in Upminster, please pray for good weather, they deserve it!

On Tuesday, 29th June, we celebrate the feast day of Saint Peter and Saint Paul, the two great Apostles; the solid rock on which the Church is built. Although we are unable to celebrate mass together, we will pray to our patron saints in our own special way.

I wish you all a lovely weekend.






They do say there is not glory without pain, and this could be where the England players finally fulfil their potential.


news that Mrs Boyle gave birth to a healthy girl this week.

Google Classrooms - Help Sheet

What is Google Classroom?



Google Classroom is a class-organisation platform that incorporates Google's core G Suite (Google Docs, Sheets, Slides, Drive) and other Google products so students can access everything they need for a class, including homework assignments, group projects and files. Google Classroom is designed for organisation and collaboration. We will be using Google Classroom to assign homework as well as within school to improve children's digital literacy.


How do you log into a Google Classroom?

Your child has been given a username (email address) and a password, these should be stuck inside their communication or homework books. You have also received an email and/or text with the information. To access it you can search 'Google login', once you have logged in using the username and password you have access to email, classroom and Google drive (a storage system that uses the Google version of Word, Excel and PowerPoint).

When you log in look for the 'waffle' (the nine dots).



You will then see these options and you select 'Classroom'



Each class is private to the people the teacher has personally invited, including the students enrolled in that class and other teachers. Once your child has accessed a class, they can use all the features the teacher has enabled for that class, including class schedules, assignments and announcements.

Can you use Google Classroom at home?

Children can access Google Classroom from anywhere, including from their phones or tablets, when they download the Google Classroom app.

How does my child find out about new stuff posted in Google Classroom?

Your child will receive an email when the teacher posts an announcement. These emails come through your child's email account, not in Classroom. Classroom doesn't alert you when an assignment is due; to keep track of deadlines, kids need to check the class calendar.
