Saint of the Week: St Bernardine of Siena (1380-1444)

Saint Bernardine of Siena travelled ceaselessly from city to city preaching the good news of the Gospel over many decades. He was first and foremost vowed to poverty, chastity, and obedience as a Franciscan Friar. Saint Bernardine was also ordained into the one Priesthood of Jesus Christ by a successor of the Apostles.

Saint Bernardine was one of the many bright lights of fifteenth-century Italy who did everything in his power to create a holier Church through his preaching and witness. He was such a thoroughly compelling and entertaining speaker that enormous crowds turned out to hear him, normally first thing in the morning. He encouraged devotion to the Holy Name of Jesus and often held the IHS monogram in his hand when preaching.

In the Franciscan tradition, Bernardine of Siena walked everywhere. No horse or mule or carriage for the journey. He was a sophisticated thinker with a common touch.

Saint Bernardine of Siena, inspire all preachers and priests to fortify their words with impeccable lives of prayer, fasting, devotion, and virtue, just as you did.

According to **Article 15** of the **UN Convention on the Rights of the Child**, every child has the right to meet with other children and to join groups and organisations, as long as this does not stop other people from enjoying their rights. Having freedom of association is important for children and young people of all ages. It's good for their mental wellbeing, sense of belonging, for learning from each other, developing new skills and amplifying their voice to bring about change.

Therefore you can reflect on the fact that...

- Young people have a right to participate and to be listened to and be heard.
- We can learn a lot from other children and young people that helps to form our views and opinions about different things.
- Meeting others helps us learn and develop new skills: how to resolve issues, find ways to compromise, share, encourage, show support and empathy.
- By being with other people, we learn more about ourselves.
- Joining groups or organisations can help us learn more about different issues.
- People can be stronger together. Joining together as a group, we can bring about change.
- It can be good for our mental health and wellbeing.










Reception - iPad Art


Reception - PSHE

Although YouTube Kids is obviously intended to be (and mainly succeeds in being) an extremely child-friendly platform, it has still raised concerns over its advertising policy as well as inappropriate content seeping through the curation process. Google Classrooms - Help Sheet

What is Google Classroom?



Google Classroom is a class-organisation platform that incorporates Google's core G Suite (Google Docs, Sheets, Slides, Drive) and other Google products so students can access everything they need for a class, including homework assignments, group projects and files. Google Classroom is designed for organisation and collaboration. We will be using Google Classroom to assign homework as well as within school to improve children's digital literacy.


How do you log into a Google Classroom?

Your child has been given a username (email address) and a password, these should be stuck inside their communication or homework books. You have also received an email and/or text with the information. To access it you can search 'Google login', once you have logged in using the username and password you have access to email, classroom and Google drive (a storage system that uses the Google version of Word, Excel and PowerPoint).

When you log in look for the 'waffle' (the nine dots).



You will then see these options and you select 'Classroom'



Each class is private to the people the teacher has personally invited, including the students enrolled in that class and other teachers. Once your child has accessed a class, they can use all the features the teacher has enabled for that class, including class schedules, assignments and announcements.

Can you use Google Classroom at home?

Children can access Google Classroom from anywhere, including from their phones or tablets, when they download the Google Classroom app.

How does my child find out about new stuff posted in Google Classroom?

Your child will receive an email when the teacher posts an announcement. These emails come through your child's email account, not solely in the Classroom. Classrooms do not alert you when an assignment is due; to keep track of deadlines, kids need to check the class calendar.
